Based on MLA Handbook of Writers of Research Papers, 7th ed.

Examples of Works Cited

Examples shown here are single-spaced. MLA format requires all references be double-spaced.
Use 12-pt. Times New Roman.

General Format For Electronic Sources

- Author name – if no author begin with the title of the work
- Title of work
- Print-like publication information – if it is applicable, use print-like information as used on the MLA (Print Sources).
- Use the following for missing information:
 - n.pag for missing page numbers
 - n.p. for missing publisher
 - n.d. for missing date
- Electronic publication information – If applicable, include the name of the Web site or database (*italicized*) and the medium.
- Access information – include the date that you accessed the work. Only include the URL if is necessary to locate the work or if required by your instructor. Typically, do not include the URL of a Web page since most works can be found by searching the author and title. When you do include a URL it follows the access date, a period, and a space. It is enclosed in angle brackets and is followed by a period.
