PHYSICAL THERAPY

School of Health Professions

Physical therapists are licensed doctors who work with multiple patient populations impacted by disease, injury, and movement dysfunction. They optimize quality of life by maintaining, restoring, and improving a patient's ability to move, function, and live a more active lifestyle.

► Doctor of Physical Therapy (DPT)

Our 101-credit doctoral program prepares you to obtain state licensure and enter the physical therapy profession as a compassionate, ethical and evidence-based practitioner for the management of neuromusculoskeletal impairments.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY

School of Health Professions

► Master of Science in Occupational Therapy (MSOT)

Our 75-credit MSOT program prepares you to become a skilled and compassionate occupational therapist, serving a diverse range of conditions in a variety of health care community-based settings.

The program is offered in two formats:

- Hybrid with courses one day each week at our Loudoun campus in Leesburg, Virginia
- Hybrid with courses on weekends (Saturday-Sunday) approximately twice a month for a total of seven weekends in a semester at our Winchester campus.

► Doctor of Occupational Therapy (OTD)

Our 107-credit, entry-level OTD program not only prepares you to become a skilled and compassionate occupational therapist, but it also offers additional focus on clinical practice skills, research skills, administration, leadership, policy development and advocacy. In addition, doctoral students complete a culminating capstone project.

► Master of Science in Speech-Language Pathology (MS SLP)

Our 60-credit MS SLP program is designed for students with a bachelor's degree in communication disorders or related fields (psychology, biology, education, etc.) and provides academic and clinical coursework needed to meet national certification and Virginia state licensure requirements.

APPLIED BEHAVIOR ANALYSIS

College of Arts & Sciences

ABA therapists assess their clients' behavioral issues or behavior reduction. Then they work on skill acquisition.

Our ABA programs emphasize the analysis and design of the environment to improve the performance of individuals as varied as children or adults with autism or intellectual and developmental disorders, parents of children with challenging behaviors, and the corporate executive attempting to maximize employee productivity.

► Master of Science in Applied Behavior Analysis (MS ABA)

Our program consists of 33 credit hours, including 21 credit hours of required coursework, 6 credit hours of electives, and 6 credit hours for a capstone project. Students arrange their own supervision with recommendations from SU faculty.

Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA)

Our 21-credit, seven-course certificate is designed for students who already hold a master's degree or are currently pursuing a master's degree in another content area. The curriculum focuses on the use of behavioral assessment methodologies, empirically driven measurement and analysis, and the selection and implementation of function-based treatment strategies that address socially significant behaviors.

CLINICAL MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Clinical mental health counselors work with their clients to establish goals and develop approaches to address emotional issues, shore up skills in coping and communication, improve self-esteem, promote changes in behavior and strive for improved mental well-being.

► Master of Science in Clinical Mental Health Counseling (MS)

Our 60-credit MS in Clinical Mental Health Counseling program provides students with the knowledge and skills to deliver individual and group counseling services grounded in evidence-based practices. Students develop their theoretical orientation through coursework, practicum, and internships and will learn ethical and legal foundations as well as diverse content to work with varied clientele and diagnoses.

SCHOOL COUNSELING

School of Health Professions

A school counselor is a certified/licensed professional that provides academic, career, college readiness, and social-emotional support for all students. There are school counselor positions within each level of schooling.

▶ Master of Science in School Counseling

Our 60-credit School Counseling program prepares students to become professional school counselors equipped to support the academic, career, and personal/social development of children and adolescents in PreK-12 educational settings. *Pending approval from the Virginia Board of Education.*

PHARMACY

School of Pharmacy

Pharmacists are medication experts who enhance patient care and promote wellness. Pharmacists use their professional knowledge to prepare and dispense prescriptions, ensure medicines and doses are correct, prevent harmful drug interactions, and counsel patients on the safe and appropriate use of their medications. They also prepare personalized medications, participate in patient rounds at the hospital, reduce the spread of infections, conduct research or clinical trials, or focus on a specific patient population or disease state.

PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT STUDIES

School of Health Professions

A physician assistant (PA) is a licensed medical professional who holds an advanced degree and can provide direct patient care. PAs work with patients of all ages in virtually all specialty and primary care areas, diagnosing and treating common illnesses and working with minor procedures.

► Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies (MS PAS)

Our 89-credit Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies program integrates graduate-level critical thinking and analysis, problem solving, scientific inquiry, hands-on experience in full-dissection cadaver anatomy, self-directed learning and the effective use of modern technology for professional practice that includes elements of research, leadership, education, and continued enhancement of the physician assistant profession. The program offers clinical rotations in medically underserved communities.

► Doctor of Medical Science in Physician Assistant Studies (DMS)

Our 30-credit DMS program is a doctorate made for physician assistants to provide the advanced skills needed in today's dynamic healthcare environment. The focus of this clinical doctorate program is to advance student knowledge in health care science, evidence-based practice, health equity, and leadership.

DUAL DEGREES

► Physician Assistant/Master of Public Health (MS/MPH)

Our dual degree program emphasizes a medical curriculum that prepares PA students to apply broad knowledge and basic skills in public health in only two additional full-time semesters. There is also an option to complete the MPH on a part-time basis.

► Physician Assistant/Performing Arts Medicine Certificate

NURSING

School of Nursing

Nurses with an advanced degree provide high-level leadership and primary care to people of all ages. They work in collaboration with physicians and other health professionals.

► Master of Science in Nursing (MSN)

Our MSN program offers three distinct specialties in cohorts that are established annually in the fall semester.

Key Features for MSN:

- Online, synchronous courses that meet one day each week
- Immersion experiences in-person at our Winchester campus to ensure students build critical person-to-person health care skills
- Clinical placement is a collaborative process between the student and the faculty
- Small cohort sizes of 15-20 students per specialty
- Experienced faculty who are active practitioners
- Near-perfect pass rates in all three specialty areas

▶ Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP)

45 Credits/ 600 clinical hours*

The MSN FNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

▷ Nurse-Midwifery

49 credits/720 clinical hours* + experiences

Nurse-midwives are advanced practice nurses who provide family-centered primary health care to women throughout their reproductive lives, including counseling and care during pre-conception, pregnancy, childbirth, postpartum and the neonatal period. Midwifery is one of the most rewarding advanced practice nursing occupations, providing you with the framework to promote physiologic birth and affirm the power and strength of individuals while addressing their general health care. The program can be completed full-time in two years.

▶ Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP)

46 Credits/ 600 clinical hours*

The MSN PMHNP program is designed to provide nurses with the necessary education, competencies, and experiences to assume the role of a PMHNP in a variety of settings. The program consists of didactic and clinical course content essential to provide psychotherapy to individuals, families and groups within hospitals and community settings. The program can be completed in seven semesters.

*Note: Due to changes in national standards, for students beginning clinicals in Fall 2024 or later, the clinical hours requirements will likely increase to at least 780 hours.

BSN - Accelerated Second Degree in Nursing

Our innovative accelerated Bachelor of Science in Nursing allows students with non-nursing bachelor's degrees to earn a degree in 15 months. *Learn more at su.edu/absn*

► Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

We offer both BSN-to-DNP and MSN-to-DNP tracks.

Key Features for DNP:

- Open to all advanced practice registered nurses (nurse practitioners, certified nursemidwives, clinical nurse specialists and certified registered nurse anesthetists) who hold a master's degree and are nationally certified as an APRN (NP, CNS), CNM or CRNA
- Students build upon their current specialty
- Clinical placement is a collaborative process between the student and the faculty

▶ Post-Baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

Our BSN-to-DNP with a Family Nurse Practitioner (FNP) or Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner (PMHNP) specialty provides advanced education, competencies, and experiences to manage health care in a safe, effective, and efficient manner. The program can be completed in nine consecutive semesters, including summers, and offers synchronous online courses.

▶ Post-Graduate Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP)

Our 35-credit MSN-to-DNP is designed to prepare clinical nurses with the advanced knowledge and experiences necessary to manage health care in a safe, effective, and efficient manner in a variety of settings. This is an asynchronous online program with individual faculty mentorship.

POST-GRADUATE CERTIFICATES

Our post-graduate certificates offer nurses who already hold a MSN the opportunity to enroll in courses in three distinct specialties. Two tracks are available for all programs: one for licensed nurse practitioners, and one for non-nurse practitioners with MSN degrees that focus on education or leadership.

► Family Nurse Practitioner Certificate

Our FNP Certificate provides students with the necessary education, competencies, and experiences to assume the role of a primary health care provider in a variety of clinical settings through both didactic and clinical courses.

Healthcare Management Graduate Certificate

Cultural insight is an essential component in providing high-quality health care.

For example, each year a dedicated interprofessional group of health professionals and SU health professions students provides health care to rural communities on a service and learning trip to Nicaragua. The team also provides oral health preventive care for several hundred children.

Our nursing program has traveled regularly to provide care to communities along the Amazon River in South America, and athletic training students routinely study and learn in Ireland. Other countries in which health professions students have engaged in experiential learning in recent years include Belize, Cuba, Ghana, Guatemala, Kenya and Morocco.

INTERPROFESSIONAL EDUCATION FOR THE HEALTH PROFESSIONS

As a student in any of our graduate-level health care programs, you'll learn in an interprofessional environment that prepares you to operate as an essential member of a multidisciplinary health care team.

Faculty and students spanning all of our graduate health care programs meet once a semester to discuss case studies and ideas about patient care and treatment and gain new perspectives.

We offer students unique opportunities to work with programs in virtual reality as well as with the renowned Shenandoah Conservatory – through which health care students learn to provide care for performing artists or explore how the performing arts can play a role in healing and wellness.

Several different health care and arts disciplines collaborate to provide care at our Shenandoah Performing Arts Rehab Center (SPARC).

We were the first college or university in Virginia to offer graduate health-related certificates in the cutting-edge world of Esports. These programs enhance practitioners' knowledge and skills to provide injury prevention and identification, as well as treatment of esport athletes.
