WHY THE ACCELERATED 2ND DEGREE TRACK? This track is designed for students that already hold a bachelor’s or master’s degree in another discipline. This program prepares students with the skills and knowledge needed for entry-level nursing positions in a variety of diverse settings, and is completed in four (4) consecutive terms in 15 months!

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT Admission to this track is available for the fall semester at the Main Campus in Winchester, VA, and for both the fall and spring semesters at the Loudoun Location in Leesburg, VA. For priority consideration, applicants must submit all required materials by February 15 for the fall semester and November 1 for the spring semester. Admission after the priority deadline is based on program availability.

* Due to the intensity of this program, it is strongly recommended that students are not employed while enrolled.

APPLICANT ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Meet all requirements for admission to Shenandoah University
- Earn a bachelor’s or master’s degree from a regionally accredited institution
- Complete both science and general education prerequisites with a minimum GPA of 3.0 or higher in each category
- Completion of 75% of all prerequisite coursework for provisional admission; 100% completion prior to August 1 for the fall semester and December 15 for the spring semester
- Submit a letter of good standing from prior institution(s) if previously enrolled in a nursing program
