WHY THE TRANSFER TRACK? The BSN Program Transfer Track is designed for students who have completed the required prerequisite and general education coursework at other colleges/universities.

ADMISSION AND ENROLLMENT Students are admitted to this nursing program in the fourth of their eighth semester of the traditional four-year nursing track. Admission to this track is available for the fall semester at the Main Campus in Winchester, VA.

APPLICANT ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- Meet all requirements for admission to Shenandoah University
- GPA of 3.0 in all prerequisite science courses
 - Science courses must have been completed within the last 10 years to be eligible for transfer credit
 - No more than two science prerequisite courses may be repeated more than one time
- GPA of 3.0 in all other prerequisite courses
- Minimum overall score of 65 percent on the Test of Essential Academic Skills (TEAS) Exam. Students may take the exam only twice and must successfully complete the test within two years of matriculation into nursing courses.
- Submit a letter of good standing from prior institution(s) if previously enrolled in a nursing program
