Outcome Measures (Present to 2029)

- Complete Shenandoah University (SU) procedures for employing and posting for additional faculty and staff positions
- Work collaboratively with appropriate SU departments to post new faculty positions (Clinical Faculty and Academic Faculty) to university website and selected professional employment websites

- Prepare and train professionals to participate in search committees for faculty and staff searches
- Adhere to policies regarding recruitment to assure a diverse pool of candidates for all positions

- Work with SU IT department and relevant others to update websites and marketing materials for recruitment of students

- Utilize Division of Communication Sciences and Disorders (CSD) SU social media accounts as part of recruitment efforts
